What to do if you're an Identity Theft victim

- File a report with local law enforcement
- Notify your Bank and/or Credit Card companies
- File a complaint with the Federal Trade Commission

- 11. Drivers License and ID numbers

Steps to Help Prevent Identity Theft

- 1. Monitor Your Credit Report & Bank Account
- Don't Give Out Personal Information to Unknown Persons or Companies, or known if they don't need it
- 3. Protect Your Credit/Debit Cards
- 4. Protect Your Mailbox & Wallet
- 5. Do Not Reply to Unfamiliar Calls and Emails
- 6. Use Passwords & PINs That Can't Be Easily Guessed
- 7. Use Anti-Virus Software on Computers
- 8. Be Careful What You Share on Social Media
- 9. Shred Documents Containing Person Information
- 10. Be wary of individuals who request payments in gift/money cards
